### REBELS RETURN TO OXFORD, FACE VANDY

After two straight losses to SEC West foes on the road, Ole Miss returns to the friendly confines of Tad Smith Coliseum for a top-25 battle against the Vanderbilt Commodores. The Rebels are 9-0 this year at home and 25-1 in Oxford since **Andy Kennedy** took the helm last season. Mississippi State held the Rebels to a season-low 68 points in Saturday's loss, while the Bulldogs also scored the most points against the Rebels this season with 88. **Dwayne Curtis** still managed to post his ninth double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds. It was the senior's fifth double-double in the last six games. Curtis enters Wednesday's tilt 17 points shy of 1,000 for his Rebel career. Ole Miss holds a 27-21 advantage over the 'Dores all-time in Oxford.

### YEAR TWO OF KENNEDY ADMINISTRATION

In his first year at the helm, **Andy Kennedy** led an underdog Ole Miss squad to the top of the SEC Western Division and an NIT second round appearance en route to SEC Coach of the Year honors. Now in his second season, Kennedy has guided the Rebels, predicted for the second straight season to finish last in the West, to a 15-3 start after a school-record 13 straight wins to open the campaign. He has directed Ole Miss to its first national ranking since finishing No. 9 in the final polls of 2000-01. All this with a team that lost three of its top four scorers from last year and returned just two starters to go with six freshmen and 10 total newcomers.

Kennedy directed Ole Miss to a 21-13 record in 2006-07, which marked the most wins by a Rebel

head coach in his first season at the helm. It was also the most wins by any Rebel team since the 2000-01 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen squad.

The Louisville, Miss., native was introduced as the 20th head men's basketball coach in the history of the University of Mississippi on March 24, 2006. He spent the 2005-06 season as the interim head coach at the University of Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a 21-13 record and NIT Quarterfinals appearance playing a schedule rated fifth-toughest in the nation amid difficult circumstances.

In his third season as a collegiate head coach, Kennedy owns a record of 57-29 (.663 winning pct.), with a 36-16 (.692 winning pct.) mark with Ole Miss. His .663 career winning percentage is third-best among active SEC coaches.

**SCOUTING THE COMMODORES**

After getting off to a school-record 16-0 start, Vanderbilt has had a tough time on the road in conference play, losing each of its three away contests to drop three of the last four overall. Vanderbilt has beaten South Carolina and LSU in Nashville, but lost at Kentucky, Tennessee and Florida. The 17-3 'Dores still rank among the nation's leaders with 83.9 points per game, but average 73.8 points in league tilts. The sensational one-two punch of senior Shan Foster (19.5 ppg) and freshman A.J. Ogilvy (18.1 ppg) has carried Vanderbilt throughout the season. Foster has earned three SEC Player of the Week honors this season, while Ogilvy is a three-time SEC Freshman of the Week. In the most recent NCAA stats, VU ranks among the nation's top 25 teams in 3-point pct. (4th), assists (5th), and 3-pointers per game (22nd).

**OLE MISS-VANDERBILT SERIES**

Wednesday's game will be the 108th meeting between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt on the hardwood. The Commodores hold a 69-38 lead in the series, which began in 1925. Vanderbilt has taken six straight in the series, including last year's 85-80 encounter in Nashville (see page 7). Ole Miss enjoys a 27-21 advantage in games played in Oxford. The 'Dores had dropped eight straight at Tad Smith Coliseum before a 77-65 victory in 2004 and a 77-62 win in 2006. Rebel head coach **Andy Kennedy** is 1-1 against Vandy in his career, picking up a 92-83 victory at Vanderbilt during the 2005-06 campaign, his lone season as Cincinnati mentor.

**HOLDING COURT**

The Ole Miss-Vanderbilt series has been all about location in recent years. In fact, the home team has prevailed in 18 of the last 21 meetings. From 1989 through 2000, the home team held court in 14 straight games.

**TENNESSEE REBELS**

Ole Miss has just one Tennessee native on its roster in junior guard **Patrick Spach**, who hails from Memphis. One of the Rebels' four early signees for next season, **Terrico White**, is also a Memphis native.

**BEST START SINCE 2000-01**

At 15-3, Ole Miss is off to its best start since the 2000-01 squad also piled up 15 wins in its first 18

games before dropping to 15-4. A win over Vanderbilt would equal the school-record start of 16-3 through 19 games, set by the 1936-37 Rebels. The 1925-26 team (which averaged 40.6 points per game) started 16-1 before losing its final game of the year to North Carolina in the Southern Conference Tournament to finish at 16-2 in the 18-game schedule.

**CURTIS CLOSING IN ON 1,000 POINTS**

Senior center **Dwayne Curtis** has been a steady producer under the basket during his three-year Rebel career. The Chicago native enters the Vanderbilt game with 983 points at Ole Miss, 17 points shy of becoming the 30th member of the Rebels' 1,000-Point Club. Curtis is currently averaging a career-high 15.2 ppg after contributing 13.6 and 12.2 points his sophomore and junior years. If you include his freshman season at Auburn (55 points in 19 games), Curtis has scored 1,038 points in his collegiate career.

**REBELS DEFENDING SEC WEST TITLE**

Ole Miss sits in a tie for third place in the SEC West with a 2-3 record early into its division title defense. With the thrilling victory over Auburn in the 2007 regular season finale, Ole Miss earned the program's fourth SEC Western Division championship and first since 2001. Ole Miss was picked by the media to finish last in the division again this year, just like last year and 2001. Ole Miss captured consecutive division crowns in 1997 and 1998. The Rebels' four SEC West titles in the last 11 years is the most of any division rival over that span.

*THE LAST TIME...*

It was almost seven years ago - March 3, 2001 - the last time a pair of top-25 men's teams squared off at Tad Smith Coliseum. No. 14 Ole Miss throttled No. 20 Alabama 105-71 in that game, as Jason Holmes poured in a career-high 26 points on Senior Day. Three weeks later, the Rebels made their first and only appearance in the NCAA "Sweet Sixteen."

**OLE MISS-VANDERBILT COMMON FOES**

The Rebels and Commodores have played five common opponents this year in DePaul, South Alabama, Tennessee, LSU and Florida. Ole Miss owns a 4-1 record against those foes, while Vandy sports a 3-2 mark. Below is a chart of the common foes:

**REMARKABLE RPI**

At No. 14 in the latest CBS Sportsline.com simulated RPI (ratings percentage index) rankings, Ole Miss is doing pretty well for a team that was predicted to finish as low as No. 143 in the nation by one pre-season publication. The Rebels range from 14th to 16th in various simulated RPI polls this week.

**OLE MISS RANKED AFTER 7-YEAR DROUGHT**

Ole Miss is ranked for the sixth straight week, this week at No. 22 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and No. 24 in the Associated Press poll. Ole Miss is one of five SEC teams ranked this week, including No. 7/8 Tennessee, No. 18/19 Vanderbilt, No. 19/20 Florida and No. 25 Mississippi State. Ole Miss had been receiving votes for three weeks prior to their first ranking.

This week's rankings mark the first time ever that Ole Miss and Mississippi State have been among the nation's top 25 at the same time.

Prior to this season, the Rebels were last ranked in the final polls of 2000-01, when they appeared as high as No. 9 in the ESPN/USA Today rankings following their NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance.

**LEADING THE SEC**

Ole Miss ranks at or near the top of the conference in several statistical categories. **The Rebels own the league's top mark in rebounds (42.3/game), rebounding margin (+6.6) and offensive rebounds (16.2/game),** while ranking second in scoring offense (84.0 ppg) and defensive rebounds (26.1/game). They also sit in third in turnover margin, 3-pointers made and assist/turnover ratio. **Individually, Dwayne Curtis tops the conference with a .684 field-goal percentage and 4.2 offensive rebounds per game,** while posting the second-most rebounds per game at 8.7. **Chris Warren ranks second with 5.17 assists per game and third with 2.9 three-pointers per contest.**

**REBELS NEAR TOP OF NATION IN SCORING**

Despite a season-low 68 points at Mississippi State Saturday, **Ole Miss ranks second in the SEC and seventh nationally in scoring with 84.0 points per game.** The Rebels have scored 80+ points in 11 of their first 18 contests. Their 78.2 average in SEC play ranks third among league schools. **Ole Miss is on pace to rack up the second-highest scoring average in school history behind the 1970-71 team's 90.8 ppg and in front of the 1974-75 squad's 81.6 average.**

Ole Miss topped 100 points for the second time this year with a 102-76 victory over Troy on Nov. 27. It is the first time Ole Miss has topped the century mark twice in a season since the 1998-99 campaign. The 108 points in the Nov. 16 win over Lamar were the most in a game since Ole Miss beat Prairie View A&M 111-50 on Dec. 29, 1998.

**HEAD COACH  
ANDY KENNEDY**

Second Year at Ole Miss • UAB, 1991

In his second year at the Rebel helm, head coach **Andy Kennedy** has Ole Miss ranked for the first time in seven years and setting school records with winning streaks and a fast, up-tempo style of play.



Last season's **SEC Coach of the Year** guided the pre-season last-place picked Rebels to 21 wins, the most by any head coach in Ole Miss history. He is looking for more of the same with this year's team, which was also predicted to finish in the SEC West cellar.

**CREAM OF THE THIRD-YEAR COACHING CROP**

Of the 18 coaches who began their first season as a head coach at the Division I level in 2005-06, Kennedy ranks second in wins and winning percentage behind BYU's Dave Rose. The list below charts the top six third-year coaches sorted by winning percentage.

**OLE MISS RAISING \$12 MILLION  
FOR BASKETBALL PRACTICE FACILITY**

A plan to raise \$12 million for a basketball practice facility at Ole Miss was announced Monday, Jan. 28. Officials with the UMAA Foundation, the private fundraising arm for intercollegiate athletics, said more than \$6 million of the total already has been donated or pledged by excited supporters.

The 46,000-square-foot facility is to include separate practice courts, locker and meeting spaces, film rooms, players' lounges, and coaches' offices for both the men's and women's basketball teams. It also has shared weight and training rooms. The building will be located on the southwest side of the campus on the corner of Coliseum Drive and Hill Drive, across from the Gillom Sports Center.

"Games are played at Tad Smith Coliseum, but they are won on the practice court," Chancellor **Robert Khayat** said. "Our men's and women's basketball teams have demonstrated their competitiveness. This new practice facility demonstrates our commitment to support them with whatever they need to continue to be successful."

The campaign to raise private funds for the facility comes at an exciting time for Ole Miss basketball. **Andy Kennedy's** men's team, ranked among the Top 25 in the nation, is off to its best start in school history. The women's team last year advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament before losing to eventual national champion Tennessee. This year's team with new Coach **Renee Ladner** recently upset 18th-ranked Arkansas.

Groundbreaking for the new building is to be held later this spring, with construction expected to take 18 months.

"The coaches have given us their reasons regarding the need for the facility," said Athletics Director **Pete Boone**. "Now the burden is on us to provide them the tools they must have to be successful. To ensure a successful future, the answer is simple – come to games and donate the money to build our practice facility."

The effort is part of the MomentUM campaign, a four-year initiative to raise \$200 million. The campaign, which ends in December, already has raised more than \$170 million for scholarships, graduate fellowships, faculty support, residential colleges and a new law school on the Oxford campus. Also in the plan is a cancer center at the Medical Center in Jackson.

**BANGING THE BOARDS**

With a pair of senior big men leading the way, Ole Miss has established itself as one of the top rebounding teams in the nation. **The Rebels top the SEC and rank fifth nationally with 42.3 rebounds per game**, while also boasting the SEC's top rebounding margin at +6.6. Ole Miss also leads the league with 16.3 offensive boards per game, having grabbed 20+ offensive boards six times, including three times in league play. The Rebels have been out-rebounded twice all year.

On the individual level, senior center **Dwayne Curtis** is averaging a team-high 8.7 boards per game, second-most in the conference. **The Chicago native ranks first in the SEC and seventh in the nation with 4.2 offensive boards per game and is second in the league with nine double-doubles, including five in the last six games.** He has notched 25 double-doubles in his Rebel career.

**Kenny Williams** grabs 7.8 boards per contest, good for seventh in the league. The senior forward from Miami has posted four double-doubles this season, including 10 points and 12 rebounds against LSU.

**WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE**

When running an up-tempo style of offense, much of the success is determined by how many turnovers the defense can create and how few turnovers the offense commits. Ole Miss has done an outstanding job in both facets through 18 games, as the Rebels rank third in the SEC with 12.5 turnovers committed, fifth with 15.5 turnovers forced and third with a +3.0 turnover ratio. Ole Miss also boasts the league's third-best assist-turnover ratio at 1.36 (305 A, 225 TO).

Overall, Ole Miss has forced 20 or more turnovers

four times and committed 10 or less on six occasions. The Rebels have lost the turnover battle just five times this season. They had a feast with Louisiana-Monroe on Nov. 24, creating 31 Warhawk turnovers and giving up the ball just eight times.

**PERFECT NON-CONFERENCE**

Ole Miss is a perfect 13-0 against non-conference opponents this season, with just one non-league matchup remaining, vs. Presbyterian on Feb. 11. **The only Rebel squad to ever go undefeated in its regular-season non-conference schedule is the 1948-49 team that was 4-0 outside of league play en route to an 8-13 overall record.**

**OLE MISS GETS BY DEFENDING CHAMPS**

The Rebels put another notch in their ever-growing NCAA Tournament résumé with an 89-87 win over two-time defending national champion Florida on Jan. 16. It was the Rebels' first win over Florida since 2002 after failing the last six tries. It took a gritty battle to tough out the two-point win as the Gators made several second-half runs and Ole Miss had a hard time from the charity stripe, hitting just 6-of-13 free throws in the final 2:17. Freshman **Trevor Gaskins** knocked down several key shots in the second half en route to his 19 points, while senior center **Dwayne Curtis** was steady as ever with game highs of 20 points (8-of-9 FGs) and 12 rebounds.

**SCHOOL-RECORD 13-0 START SNAPPED**

An 85-83 loss at No. 8 Tennessee snapped Ole Miss' school-record start at 13-0. That mark surpassed the 1936-37 and 2000-01 teams that reeled off 11

straight wins to open their seasons. Ole Miss was one of six unbeaten teams left in the nation at the time of the loss.

**SCHOOL-RECORD WIN STREAK ENDS**

The Tennessee loss also snapped the school-record win streak of 13. **The Rebels' 86-50 win over Alabama A&M broke the school record for most consecutive wins, topping the previous record of 12 straight wins put up by the 1926 Rebel squad, 82 years earlier.** The streak is tied for the seventh-longest in the nation this year.

**REBELS NEARLY KNOCK OFF NO. 8 VOLS**

Ole Miss led by four points with 2:22 left in its SEC opener at No. 8 Tennessee, but the Vols scored the game's final six points, including Tyler Smith's game-winning layup with 4.2 seconds left, to hand the Rebels their first loss of the season. An Ole Miss win would have been the first over a top-10 team since an 84-56 win over No. 6 Alabama on March 3, 2002 in Oxford. The last Rebel victory over a top 10 foe on the road came in Lexington on Feb. 14, 1998, when the No. 18 Rebels upended No. 7 Kentucky 73-64.

**REBELS ON THE TUBE**

Ole Miss' game at Mississippi State televised by FSN South was the seventh TV appearance this year and the fifth of five straight after seeing a school-record 22 games televised a year ago. Ole Miss is slated to play at least 14 games on TV this year, which will mark the 10th straight season that the Rebels played 10 or more TV games.

**HE CAN'T MISS (MUCH)**

In addition to providing senior leadership for the nationally ranked Rebels, center **Dwayne Curtis** has produced an outstanding season stats-wise thus far. Curtis ranks second on the team and 14th in the SEC with 15.2 ppg and ranks second in the SEC with 8.7 rebounds per game and first with 4.2 offensive boards per contest (7th in nation). **The Chicago native leads the league and ranks second in the nation in field-goal percentage, hitting shots at a 68.4 percent clip.** Curtis has shot 80 percent or better from the field in eight games, including 4-of-5 vs. MVSU, 3-of-3 vs. South Alabama, 8-of-9 vs. Lamar, 8-of-10 vs. New Mexico, 10-of-12 vs. Winthrop, 5-of-6 vs. Alabama A&M, 5-of-6 vs. LSU and 8-of-9 vs. Florida.

Curtis has posted double-figure points in all but one game (8 vs. Louisiana-Monroe) and grabbed 10 or more rebounds in nine contests. His nine double-doubles rank second in the SEC behind Alabama forward Richard Hendrix's 10.

**FABULOUS FRESHMAN FLOOR GENERAL**

Freshman point guard **Chris Warren** has been a tremendous addition to the Rebels this season after the departure of All-SEC floor general Todd Abernethy. The rookie leads Ole Miss in scoring (15.8 ppg), assists (5.17/game), three-pointers (2.94/game) and minutes played (30.4/game). He ranks second in the

The Orlando native has scored in double figures in all but one game (8 vs. Florida). He has dished out 5 or more assists in 10-of-17 contests. **Warren poured in a career-high 25 points at Auburn and tied Trevor Gaskins' Ole Miss freshman record with seven treys. He is averaging a team-high 17.4 ppg in SEC contests.** He has already earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors twice and was named the MVP of the San Juan Shootout.

**POLYNICE FILLING IT UP**

Sophomore guard **Eniel Polynice** has put up big numbers in several columns of the stat sheet this season. STARKVILLE, Miss. (AP) -- Despite Dwayne Curtis' double-double, No. 15 Ole Miss suffered a second straight road setback in a 88-68 battle at rival Mississippi State Saturday afternoon. Charles Rhodes scored 26 points and Jamont Gordon had 13 as the Bulldogs used a strong defense to pull the upset.

Curtis led Ole Miss with 18 points and 11 boards, while Chris Warren had 15 and Eniel Polynice 14.

Rhodes and frontcourtmate Jarvis Varnado forced early foul trouble for the Rebels (15-3, 2-3 SEC) and harassed them the entire game as the Bulldogs (14-5, 5-0) extended their winning streak to nine games overall and five in the SEC.

Gordon also had six assists, while Barry Stewart and Riley Benock added 12 points each for MSU.

Ole Miss, which entered the game No. 8 in the nation in scoring at 84.9 points per game, struggled from its first offensive possession when Varnado opened the game with a block. The Bulldogs held the Rebels to 36.8 pct. shooting.

The Rebels rallied to take their biggest lead, 17-13 with 12:02 left in the first half, but Varnado answered with six straight points during an 18-7 run that put Mississippi State up 32-26 with 3:39 left in the first half. Varnado, the nation's leading shot blocker, finished with four blocks, eight rebounds and 12 points and constantly forced the Rebels to alter their shots.

**GASKINS MAKES SPLASH AS ROOKIE**

One of several freshmen and newcomers contributing for the Rebels this year, guard Trevor Gaskins has made a big impact with his ability to hit from long range. The Alpharetta, Ga., native ranks 12th in the league with 1.89 three's made per game.

Gaskins loomed large in the Rebels' 89-87 win over Florida with 19 points on 6-of-9 from the field and 3-of-5 from behind the arc, including several big shots to halt Gator runs in the second half. He got off to a furious start to his Ole Miss career in the season opener. He finished one 3-pointer shy of the school record with seven treys on 10 attempts, but did collect the freshman record previously held by Josh Hayes, who stroked six three's against Troy State on Dec. 18, 2000 and Joe Harvell, who had six vs. Kentucky on Jan. 27, 1990. The Ole Miss record of eight was set by Keith Carter against Prairie View on Dec. 29, 1998.

**OTHER PLAYER POINTS**

• **Zach Graham:** An "explosive scorer" according to Kennedy, the rookie from Suwanee, Ga., has proved that true by averaging 5.9 points in 11.8 minutes per game. Had his best game of the season with 12 points and 7 rebounds at Auburn, logging a season-high 21 minutes. Posted double figure points in back-to-back games vs. Lamar (12) and Louisiana-Monroe (13). Poured in all nine of his points at UCF in the first half. Scored eight points with four free-throws vs. USM. Posted six points and six boards vs. Alabama A&M.

• **David Huertas:** The Puerto Rican hit at least one three-pointer in nine straight games from 12/21 to 1/16. He has struggled in his last two games, though, going 1-of-16 from the field and 0-9 from behind the arc. He tied a career high when he poured in a game-high 17 points against Alabama A&M. Nailed a career-high 5 3-pointers vs. the Bulldogs. Scored 14 points and grabbed 5 rebounds vs. La Salle and Clemson. Had 12 points, 4 assists, 3 rebounds and 3 steals against Southern Miss. The long-range threat made back-to-back 3-pointers in the second half to close a 7-point deficit to just one in the win over Winthrop. He also scored 17 points vs. ULM.

• **Jermey Parnell:** Has missed three of the last four games with a high ankle sprain. Injured his ankle in the second half at Tennessee and returned to play limited minutes vs. Florida. He remains day-to-day. Started the first three games of the season and came off the bench for the next nine before starting the next two. **WARREN GRABS 2ND SEC FRESHMAN HONOR**

For the second time this season, Rebel point guard **Chris Warren** was named the SEC Freshman of the Week, as announced by the league office on Dec. 24. The 5-foot-10 guard received San Juan Shootout MVP distinction after scoring 41 of his 49 points in the second half of the three Rebel wins in Puerto Rico. He poured in 19 points against both La Salle and Clemson, while adding nine assists and just two turnovers against the Explorers. In Saturday's 85-82 win over previously unbeaten No. 15 Clemson, Warren tallied eight of the Rebels' 10 points in the final four minutes to claim the tournament title.

**CURTIS TABBED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK**

After garnering SEC Player of the Week accolades on Dec. 17, senior center **Dwayne Curtis** was honored as National Player of the Week on Dec. 24 by CollegeHoops.net. Curtis poured in 19 points and had nine rebounds in the final against No. 15 Clemson, and he put up 21 points and seven boards against DePaul and 14 and five against La Salle. Curtis shot 61 percent from the field and 88 percent from the free-throw line in the three games.

**REBELS CLAIM SAN JUAN SHOOTOUT TITLE**

With wins over DePaul, La Salle and No. 15 Clemson, Ole Miss claimed the 2007 San Juan Shootout title. The championship game vs. the previously unbeaten Tigers saw Ole Miss earn a victory over its first ranked foe of the season and move to 11-0. Freshman point guard **Chris Warren** was named the Tournament MVP with 19 points in each of the last two games. Senior center **Dwayne Curtis** also earned a spot on the All-Tournament team after averaging a team-high 18.0 points over three games.

**CURTIS NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

After scoring 22 points with 11 rebounds and helping Ole Miss to a 76-71 win over Winthrop, senior center **Dwayne Curtis** was tabbed as the SEC Player of the Week on Dec. 17. Curtis posted his fourth double-double in the last six games and collected season

highs in points and rebounds vs. the Eagles. He finished three points shy of his career high and made good on 10-of-12 from the floor. It was the second weekly honor for a Rebel this season and the second career honor for Curtis, who was the SEC POW on Jan. 7, 2006 after leading Ole Miss to a win at Alabama with 21 points and 14 rebounds.

**PACKING THE PAD**

Over the last decade, the "Tad Pad" has proven to be one of the toughest arenas in the nation for opposing teams to play, and second-year head coach **Andy Kennedy** has only added to that success. **Ole Miss owns a 25-1 record at Tad Smith Coliseum since Kennedy took the reins last season.** The Oxford crowds have jumped on board, too. **This year's LSU game saw the Tad Pad's second-highest attendance ever with 9,328 fans and the Florida game crowd of 9,304 ranks sixth in arena annals.**

Last year's 16-1 mark established an arena record for single-season wins. Kennedy's club inspired a huge homecourt advantage during SEC play, averaging 8,241 fans and drawing a record crowd of 9,452 for the victory over No. 18 Alabama.

Ole Miss has won 156 of its last 189 games (.825 winning percentage) in Oxford dating back to the 1995-96 campaign. The Rebels have an all-time record of 391-180 (.685 winning percentage) at Tad Smith Coliseum, which opened in 1965-66. He hit 5-of-9 from behind the arc and directed a 25-0 run at the beginning of the second half to put the game out of reach. He also contributed 16 points, five assists and three steals, with just two turnovers, in a game-high 35 minutes of action in the 85-77 victory over UNM.

**OLE MISS VISITS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL**

As part of their trip to the Mississippi state capital, the Ole Miss players, coaches and staff visited the Blair E. Batson Children's Hospital at the University of Mississippi Medical Center while in Jackson for the Winthrop game. The Rebels played games and handed out posters and basketballs while visiting with kids at the hospital before their open practice and autograph session later that day.

**CURTIS TABBED PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

Senior center **Dwayne Curtis** has established himself as one of the top post men in the SEC and has been named to the preseason All-SEC second team by the media and league coaches. He was also rated the SEC's "Most Underrated" by *The Sporting News*. The Chicago, Ill., native averaged 12.2 points and 8.3 rebounds for last year's SEC West champions.

**OLE MISS BASKETBALL INKS FOUR EARLY SIGNEES**

The Ole Miss basketball program bolstered its future on Nov. 15, as head coach Andy Kennedy announced the signing of high school seniors **Terrance Henry, Brandon Wilson, Terrico White** and **Will Bogan** to national letters of intent.

Henry and Wilson will join the Rebels after playing together at Carroll High School in Monroe, La., for coach Chris Oney, who played point guard at Ole Miss in 1996-97. White played prep ball at Craigmont High School in Memphis, while Bogan will arrive in Oxford from Vallivue High School in Caldwell, Idaho.

A 6-foot-9, 190-pound forward out of Monroe, La., Henry may be Kennedy's signature signee in his two years of recruiting at Ole Miss. He is the highest rated Rebel freshman signee since Justin Reed, who was the nation's 24th-ranked prospect by ESPN.com in 2000. A consensus top-100 national recruit, Henry is ranked the country's 60th-best prospect by Scout.com, No. 83 by Rivals.com and No. 95 by ESPN.com. Scout lists him as the nation's No. 19 power forward and ESPN the No. 24 power forward, while Rivals has him as the No. 12 small forward. The athletic lefty said he chose Ole Miss over such programs as Kansas, Kentucky, LSU, Arkansas and Miami (Fla.).

Wilson played at Carroll this year after starring at nearby Rayville (La.) High School through his junior season. A 6-foot-5, 205-pound guard/forward, Wilson averaged 19 points and eight rebounds as a junior at Rayville. At 6-5, Wilson has a wingspan of over seven feet, one of the attributes that helped him shine at the Ole Miss Elite Summer Camp. He is ranked as a three-star prospect by both Rivals.com and Scout.com.

At 6-foot-5 and 195 pounds, White is a highly coveted big guard who put up 22.2 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals per game last season at Craigmont. The high flyer and accurate shooter helped Craigmont to the state quarterfinals as a junior and was a finalist for the Commercial Appeal's Best of the Preps Player of the Year award. White, who said he chose Ole Miss over Arkansas, is ranked by Youth Prep Stars recruiting magazine as the No. 35 overall player in the Southeast and has been listed as a three-star prospect by both Rivals and Scout. He has also played quarterback and receiver for the Craigmont football team.

A point guard from Caldwell, Idaho, Bogan came on strong late in his high school career to prove one of the top prospects in the Northwest. The 6-foot-1, 165-pounder was the 5A South Idaho Player of the Year and an All-State first team selection in 2007. The first Idahoan to sign with Ole Miss in the 98-year history of the program, he is also rated as a three-star prospect by Rivals.com and Scout.com. He led his Vallivue High School team to a 19-5 record and the consolation championship at the 5A state tournament last season. He is also a great student, maintaining a 4.0 GPA throughout high school.

the professional ranks after he was drafted by the Anaheim Arsenal in the seventh round of the NBA Development League Draft on Nov. 1.

A native of Phenix City, Ala., Sanders led Ole Miss and ranked fifth in the Southeastern Conference with 16.1 points per game last season en route to All-SEC second team honors from the league coaches.

Known for his ability to stroke one from behind the arc at any moment, Sanders set a school record with 96 three-pointers last season, as well as leading the SEC with 56 treys in league play.

Sanders is the third Rebel to play in the NBA D-League, which was formerly known as the NBDL. Rahim Lockhart was an All-NBDL performer in 2001-02, while Ansu Sesay was the NBDL's Player of the Year that season.

**MORE REBELS IN THE PROS**

Ole Miss' two other senior leaders from a year ago have also moved on to the professional ranks in recent months. All-SEC guard Todd Abernethy is a member of the Matrixx Magix in Holland, while Bam Doyne ranks second on his Falco KC-Szombathely team with 20.3 points per game after seven contests in the Hungary League.

Other Rebels currently playing professionally overseas include Derrick Allen (Germany), Keith Carter (Italy), Aaron Harper (Ukraine), Londrick Nolen (Uruguay), Ansu Sesay (Italy), Jason Smith (Romania) and LaTaryl Williams (England).

**COOLIDGE BALL TO ENTER HALL OF FAME**

Former Ole Miss basketball greats Coolidge Ball and Jennifer Gillom are among six in the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame's Class of 2008. They will be formally enshrined Aug. 1-2, 2008 at the BancorpSouth Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame Weekend.

In 1970, Ball became Ole Miss' first black student-athlete. His ground-breaking career saw him earn UPI All-SEC third team honors in all three of his varsity seasons, and garner All-SEC distinction from the league coaches in 1972 and 1973. Ball compiled 1,072 points in his career and helped direct the Rebels to three straight winning seasons for the first time since 1936-38.

Following his days in the Red and Blue, Ball played professionally for the IBL's Hamilton, Ohio team. He later spent four years as an assistant coach at Northwest Community College.

A native of Indianaola, Miss., Ball has remained an active part of the Ole Miss basketball family and has served as president of the Rebel Tip-Off Club.

Ole Miss shot 56.7 percent in building a 41-24 halftime lead. MVSU got as close as 12 at the 17:11 mark of the second half, but Ole Miss responded with a 10-2 run.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) — Eniel Polynice scored a career-high 28 points and sparked a decisive game-opening 11-0 surge Tuesday as Ole Miss defeated South Alabama 81-78.

Polynice finished 10-of-15 from the field, including 7-of-11 from three-point range and added seven rebounds with four assists. Chris Warren had 12 points, Kenny Williams added 11 and Dwayne Curtis had 10 to lead the Rebels.

Ole Miss (2-0) led by 22 in the first half and held on late. Freshman guard Terrence Watson deflected an inbounds pass by South Alabama (1-1) with 1.5 seconds remaining to preserve the win.

Ole Miss built a lead of 22 points after holding LSU to nine points in the first 9 minutes of the second half. But LSU rallied with an 18-2 run that White, a freshman playing for injured starter Jeremy Parnell, ended by scoring four straight points. And Curtis stopped a second run with a three-point play that made it 69-61 with 2:02 left.

White finished with 12 points and six rebounds in his first significant playing time and Curtis had 11 points.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- In a game loaded with talented freshmen, an often overlooked senior helped No. 15 Ole Miss finally beat Florida.

The Gators started fast, hitting three straight 3-pointers on the way to an 11-4 lead to open the game.

Ole Miss reeled off a 17-1 run in answer to Florida's fast start. Curtis had two layups and a short jumper during the spurt and the Rebels led 23-12 midway through the first half.

They held Florida without a field goal for 6:06 during the run, forcing four turnovers, and the Gators missed eight shots.

Ole Miss would never trail again, but had to withstand several runs by Florida. The Gators scored eight straight points to get within 43-34 at halftime. Freshman Trevor Gaskins hit two 3-pointers and a short jumper during the run and finished with 19 points.

Nick Calathes finished with 16 points, tied with Dan Werner for the team lead. He hit a 3-pointer with 12 seconds left that cut Ole Miss' lead to 88-85 and nearly gave Florida the win at the buzzer with a full-court shot that bounced off the top of the backboard just above the rim.

AUBURN, Ala. (AP) -- In a back-and-forth SEC battle, Auburn surged midway through the second half and held off 15th-ranked Ole Miss Saturday 80-77 on the Plains, keeping the Rebels from matching the best start in school history.

Chris Warren played all 40 minutes and led Ole Miss with a career-high 25 points, hitting seven 3-pointers. Dwayne Curtis returned to Auburn with 13 points and 11 rebounds for his eighth double-double of the year.

Frank Tolbert scored 29 points and DeWayne Reed had 21, both career highs, to lead Auburn.

Quantez Robertson's 3-pointer from the right corner broke a 70-all tie with 1 minute left for the Tigers (11-5, 2-2 Southeastern Conference).

Eniel Polynice of Ole Miss (15-2, 2-2) then missed a 3 at the other end. Tolbert made four straight free throws and Auburn went 7-of-10 from the line over the final 39 seconds to keep Ole Miss from tying after twice pulling within three points.

Ole Miss was trying to match its 16-1 start in the 1925-26 season but fell short with yet another close one in the SEC. The Rebels' first four league games have been decided by a total of 10 points.

Reed had a career-high 20 points in Auburn's win over LSU on Wednesday night, and promptly topped that. He was 4-of-7 on 3-pointers and Auburn hit 10 of its 19 attempts from beyond the arc.

Tolbert was 9-of-11 from the field and 9-of-12 from the line. Lucas Hargrove added 10 points for the Tigers, all in the first half.

STARKVILLE, Miss. (AP) -- Despite Dwayne Curtis' double-double, No. 15 Ole Miss suffered a second straight road setback in a 88-68 battle at rival Mississippi State Saturday afternoon. Charles Rhodes scored 26 points and Jamont Gordon had 13 as Mississippi State used a strong defense to pull the upset.

Curtis led Ole Miss with 18 points and 11 boards, while Chris Warren had 15 and Eniel Polynice 14.

Rhodes and frontcourtmate Jarvis Varnado forced early foul trouble for the Rebels (15-3, 2-3 SEC) and harassed them the entire game as the Bulldogs (14-5, 5-0) extended their winning streak to nine games overall and five in the SEC.

Gordon also had six assists, while Barry Stewart and Riley Benock added 12 points each for MSU.

Ole Miss, which entered the game No. 8 in the nation in scoring at 84.9 points per game, struggled from its first offensive possession when Varnado opened the game with a block. The Bulldogs held the Rebels to 36.8 pct. shooting.

The Rebels rallied to take their biggest lead, 17-13 with 12:02 left in the first half, but Varnado answered with six straight points during an 18-7 run that put Mississippi State up 32-26 with 3:39 left in the first half. Varnado, the nation's leading shot blocker, finished with four blocks, eight rebounds and 12 points and constantly forced the Rebels to alter their shots.
