REBELS MAKE TRIP TO PUERTO RICO

Ole Miss will receive some of its first major tests of the season with its trip to San Juan for the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off this week. The Rebels are coming off a convincing 90-53 win over defending SWAC Champion and NCAA Tournament team Alabama State. They will square off with Indiana in the first ever game between the two programs in Thursday's first round (ESPN2). **Andy Kennedy's** squad will look to maintain its high-scoring approach after scoring 92 and 90 in back-to-back contests to open the season. The winner of the Ole Miss-Indiana matchup will advance to face the winner between Boston University and Kansas State on Friday. The last time Ole Miss visited the island, the team came home with the 2007 San Juan Shootout championship trophy.

QUICK NOTES

- Ole Miss is receiving votes in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today coaches poll for the second straight week.
- Ole Miss has a 40-10 record against non-conference opponents under the guidance of **Andy Kennedy**.
- The Rebel defense held Alabama State to just 28.6 percent from the field and forced 22 Hornet turnovers, including 17 steals by Rebel players.
- Ole Miss' participation in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off marks the first time the Rebels have been involved with an early-season tournament sponsored by ESPN.

- Ole Miss was picked by the media to finish second in the SEC West, while the Rebels have been tabbed as an NCAA Tournament by a number of preseason publications.
- Eniel Polynice** already ranks among the SEC leaders in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals.
- Terrico White** and **Chris Warren** were named to preseason All-SEC teams by both the media and league coaches. White was named to the first team and Warren to the second team on both lists.
- Terrico White** is a preseason candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

SCOUTING THE HOOSIERS

Indiana is off to a 2-0 start with wins over Howard (83-60) and USC-Upstate (69-61). Freshmen Maurice Creek and Christian Watford lead the team with 15.5 ppg each in the early going. Watford also pulls down a team-high 10.5 boards per game. Tom Crean's Hoosiers are coming off an uncharacteristic down season, going 6-25 and just 1-17 in Big Ten play with a short-handed group last year.

Ole Miss sophomore guard Nick Williams is currently sitting out the 2009-10 season after transferring from Indiana, where he started 29-of-31 games and averaged 8.90 ppg as a freshman last season.

REBELS AT THE BEACH

Ole Miss will participate in a tournament in a sunny, beach locale for the third straight year when it plays in the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off this week. The Rebels had much success at the San Juan Shootout in December 2007, winning the Puerto Rican tourney title with three straight wins, including an 85-82 championship game triumph over No. 15 Clemson that put Ole Miss back on the national radar screen when the team's record improved to 11-0 at the time. The Rebels went 2-1 during last year's Glenn Wilkes Classic (Daytona Beach, Fla.).

TOURNAMENT SCENARIOS

The winner of the Ole Miss-Indiana first-round matchup (ESPN2) will advance to play the winner of Boston U.-Kansas State at 9:30 p.m. AT on Friday (ESPNU), while the losers play at 7 p.m. Friday (no TV). The final round is on Sunday, with the tournament championship game scheduled for 9 p.m. local time (ESPN2). All other Sunday games will be shown on ESPNU.

record against non-league foes, becoming the second Rebel squad to accomplish that feat (1948-49). Last year, the team went 9-5 against teams outside the SEC.

BACKCOURT BRILLIANCE

Expected to boast one of the top backcourts in the SEC, and perhaps the country, Ole Miss showed a glimpse of its potent guard attack in a 90-53 win over Alabama State Monday. Four guards scored in double figures - **Terrico White** (19), **Eniel Polynice** (17), **Chris Warren** (12) and **Zach Graham** (11).

The backcourt has been ranked as high as ninth in the country by one national preseason outlet (Lindy's) and best in the SEC by another (Blue Ribbon). Warren, White, Polynice and Graham have all been a full-time starter during the last two seasons, while **Trevor Gaskins** was an SEC All-Freshman team member with Warren in 2007-08 before Gaskins missed last season with an ACL injury.

POLYNICE FILLS UP THE STAT SHEET

Healthy for the first time since 2007-08, junior guard **Eniel Polynice** is back to doing what he does best - filling up every area of the stat sheet. In Monday's win over Alabama State, Polynice had 17 points, 8 rebounds, 7 assists, 4 steals and a block. Through two games, he is averaging 13.0 points, 5.0 boards, 5.0 assists and 3.0 steals.

CRANSTON LEADS TEAM TO BIG OPENING WIN

DeAndre Cranston scored a career-high 21 points to go with seven rebounds, and Ole Miss dominated UALR en route to a 92-64 win in Friday's season opener. The Rebels got out to a 27-8 early lead and never looked back. **Murphy Holloway** also helped solidify the frontcourt play with 17 points and 10 rebounds.

ALL PLAYERS HEALTHY ENTERING 2009-10

After one of the most bizarre rashes of injuries one could imagine decimated the Ole Miss roster a year ago, all players are healthy and full-go entering the 2009-10 campaign. Sophomore guard **Trevor Gaskins** and junior guard **Eniel Polynice**, who missed all of last season with knee injuries, returned to action early in the summer. After tearing his ACL in the Rebels' 11th game last year, **Chris Warren** also returned to action during the summer. **Zach Graham** played through the last half of the season with a partially torn patella tendon, had surgery in April to repair the tear, and returned to action for preseason camp.

— MISSISSIPPI STANDOUTS COX AND NELSON SIGN WITH OLE MISS —

Ole Miss has received national letters of intent from a pair of Mississippi high school seniors, head coach Andy Kennedy announced Wednesday. Highly touted prospects **Demarco Cox** of Yazoo City and **Dundreous Nelson** of Jackson will join the Rebels for the 2010-11 academic year.

A 6-foot-8, 285-pound center, Cox averaged 15 points and eight rebounds and led coach Archie Carlyle's Yazoo City HS to the North State Finals as a junior. The four-star recruit is rated the No. 80 overall prospect and No. 9 center in the nation by Rivals.com and No. 83 overall and No. 22 power forward by ESPN.com/Scouts, Inc.

A four-star recruit in football as the nation's 25th-rated offensive tackle, Cox received interest from many schools in both sports and chose Ole Miss over the likes of Alabama, Arkansas, Maryland and Mississippi State. He played AAU ball with MBA Hoops Elite under coach Omhar Carter.

A senior at Murrah High School, Nelson is rated the top player in the state of Mississippi by Scout.com a year after he averaged 17.5 points, eight assists and four steals per game as a junior under legendary coach Bob Frith, whose program has produced NBA players such as Othella Harrington, Lindsey Hunter and Mo Williams, as well as former Rebel standout Joezon Darby. The 5-foot-11, 190-pound guard is also rated the nation's 86th-best overall prospect and No. 21 point guard by Rivals.com and the No. 30 point guard by ESPN.com/Scouts, Inc.

Known for his slashing style and ability to finish at the rim, Nelson has been a member of the Jackson Panthers AAU team under the direction of coach LeMond Roy. Nelson picked Ole Miss over such schools as Alabama, Arkansas, Kansas State, Mississippi State and USC.

They represent the first Ole Miss signees from the Magnolia State since Kennedy arrived in 2006. The last in-state signee to earn a letter for the Rebels was Kendrick Fox (Oxford) from the 2000-01 class.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Four Rebel guards scored in double figures and Ole Miss (2-0) cruised to a 90-53 win over the Alabama State Hornets (0-1) on Monday evening at Tad Smith Coliseum.

Terrico White led all scorers with 19 points. Eniel Polynice added 17 points, eight rebounds, seven assists and four steals for the Rebels. Chris Warren and Zach Graham added 12 and 11 points, respectively. Ole Miss shot 34-of-69, 49 percent, from the field.

Menji Mundadi had 13 points for Alabama State, who kept the deficit within single digits until the final six minutes of the first half.

The Rebels led 43-24 at halftime on the strength of a 10-0 run, highlighted by a three-point play from DeAundre Cranston. Alabama State was limited to eight first half baskets and missed all seven three-point attempts.

Ole Miss led by as many as 39 points in the second half.

REBELS ON THE TUBE

Thursday's game vs. Indiana on ESPN2 is the first of at least 20 Ole Miss games scheduled for live television this season, including all 16 regular-season conference games as part of the SEC's 15-year deals with CBS and ESPN. The Rebels had a school-record 22 games televised in 2006-07.

PRESEASON HYPE

In addition to being picked to finish second in the SEC West in the SEC media poll, Ole Miss received a favorable outlook from a number of preseason publications. Among the highlights are FoxSports.com predicting the Rebels to win the SEC West and placing them at No. 25 in its preseason poll. Outlets that tabbed the Rebels as an NCAA Tournament team include Lindy's, Athlon, CBS Sports, FoxSports.com and Yahoo! Sports.

Terrico White was named a preseason All-American, as well as the nation's No. 4 scorer (Athlon) and No. 4 shooting guard (Lindy's), while **Chris Warren** was tabbed the nation's No. 9 floor leader (Athlon). The Rebel backcourt has been ranked as high as 9th-best in the country (Lindy's).

WHITE MAKES NAISMITH, WOODEN LISTS

The reigning SEC Freshman of the Year, sophomore guard **Terrico White** was named to the 2009-10 Naismith Preseason Watch List and a preseason candidate for the 2009-10 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy before the season. White, who scored 18.4 ppg in league play last season, is one the nation's top 50 college basketball players on each list.

TWO REBELS PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Ole Miss sophomore guard **Terrico White** was a unanimous selection to the preseason All-SEC first team and junior guard **Chris Warren** was voted to the second team in the coaches preseason poll. They also received the same preseason All-SEC honors from the media. Ole Miss tied for the most preseason All-SEC selections among league schools. — PRACTICE FACILITY OPENING SOON —

The Ole Miss Basketball Practice Facility is in the final stages of completion and is slated to be opened to the men's and women's teams for daily operations in December.

The \$13 million facility's exterior is finished, while the Yates Construction group is putting in the final touches to the interior of the 51,000-square-foot complex.

The structure is a cornerstone in the impressive complex of athletics facilities on the southwest corner of the University of Mississippi campus.

The facility includes four distinct spaces: public, staff (coaches), team and individual practice courts for both men's and women's teams.

Spaces for the public include an attractive main rotunda/lobby to receive visitors and display men's and women's basketball memorabilia and a multimedia/entertainment meeting room that can be used for Media Days as well as for video presentations and team functions.

The staff/coaches spaces are adjacent to the rotunda/lobby, where receptionists will direct visitors to their destinations. A separate entrance for coaches is provided. Coaches' offices, a conference room, a copy center, and staff locker and dressing facilities complete the suites. The head coaches' offices provide direct access to and view of their respective practice courts.

The team spaces are specialized with shared weight and training rooms, and separate men's and women's film rooms, including computer terminals and video access. Separate team lounges also include computer access, game area and kitchenette. Finally, there are spacious locker and dressing facilities, with a central laundry, video editing rooms, small guest viewing space of the courts, storage and equipment storage.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Ole Miss has two preseason All-SEC guards Chris Warren and Terrico White in their starting lineup, enhancing their reputation as a strong perimeter team.

That reputation may have changed after a 92-64 win over UALR. Forwards DeAndre Cranston and Murphy Holloway scored 21 and 17 points, respectively and combined for 17 rebounds in an overwhelming debut for the Rebels.

The Rebels (1-0) were never seriously threatened. An early 21-3 surge built an insurmountable 27-8 lead as UALR managed only three baskets in the opening 10 minutes. Ole Miss led 44-30 at halftime and by as much as 32 points throughout the second half.

White added 16 points, 11 in the second half and four steals for the Rebels, who shot 35-of-72, 47 percent, from the field. Cranston was 8-of-9 from the field, including three from the three-point line while Holloway was 7-of-10.

UALR (0-1) was led by Solomon Bozeman and Wayne Burton with 12 and 11 points. The Trojans out-rebounded Ole Miss 39-38 but turned the ball over 22 times.

Along with the offensive dominance inside, the Rebels had only five turnovers. While Warren was limited to nine points, he had five assists and four steals.
